Background

This item was raised at Council by Cllr Steve Campkin and delegated to P&H to review, since then 2 members of the public have also contacted the Clerk to raise concerns about the parking on this corner. However as referenced and agreed in prior reports and in the recommendations to Committee outlined above, any action considered for this issue needs to be taken in conjunction with the whole road and the overarching parking situation in the SWAN area.

Highway Code parking laws at junctions Rule 243 states you should not park within 16 metres or 32 feet of a junction except in an authorised space, near the brow or of a hill or a hump back bridge, near an entrance to a property. Full extract below. These rules are not being followed

DO NOT stop or park:

- near a school entrance
- anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services
- at or near a bus or tram stop or taxi rank
- on the approach to a level crossing/tramway crossing
- opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- near the brow of a hill or hump bridge
- opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle
- where you would force other traffic to enter a tram lane
- where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles
- in front of an entrance to a property
- on a bend
- where you would obstruct cyclists' use of cycle facilities

except when forced to do so by stationary traffic.

Furthermore rules for parking on hills are also not being followed, particularly turning in of wheels and lights in bad weather. See Full extract below.

Rule 252

Parking on hills. If you park on a hill you should:

- park close to the kerb and apply the handbrake firmly
- select a forward gear and turn your steering wheel away from the kerb when facing uphill
- select reverse gear and turn your steering wheel towards the kerb when facing downhill
- use 'park' if your car has an automatic gearbox.





Evidence

Evidence gathered shown in the photographed appendix, highlights the dangers of the parking and vehicles moving at speed, the lack of safety for pedestrians, particularly for the premises on the corner of Mead Road. That the parking is a weekday issue not a weekend issue suggesting it is possibly workers within the firms on Canterbury Road creating the illegal parking looking for space to park for work.



A report of the Clerk to consider the location of 2 Happy to Chat Benches.

Recommendations of 4 sites members to choose 2.

Fairview Drive aside play park

SWAN Farm

Newtown Green

Allotments

Options to Consider

Swan Farm

SWAN Farm have asked if a bench could be located on the main path passing through the fields next to the Plum Tree overlooking the lambing field owned by Ashford Borough Council.

It would be a safer area as there is rarely activity of an evening or night, as it is unlit, it is visited daily by the Farm staff, it is a popular walk way so there would be people passing through who would use it.

Permission would be needed from Ashford Borough Council but it is the understanding of the Clerk that this can be granted by the ABC Ward Cllr.

Saturdays and Sundays there are people working on the farm who are very keen to have the bench and to encourage people to use it and would be very very happy to chat to anyone using it. Cons

Members to consider if any negatives in placing the bench here.

Fairview Drive Green area aside the Play Park

Permission has been given by Fairview Homes and DLM Management Company have agreed to work with SWANCC as to the best location of this bench to avoid any issues for tenants in Block Q. (see attached email)

The bench would be passed daily by residents and tenants in that area, there is no other bench on the green area although there are several along the following footpath when turning right from the play park.

Benefits

The area has a large number of residents who would benefit from the bench,

The area is used regularly by park users, dog walkers and pedestrians.

Cons

Block Q had problems with a bench the other end of the green proposed and it had to be removed, although the Management company are confident the other end of the green nearest the pavement to the road could be successful.

It is at risk of vandalism as it is a very open area but it would be well used.

Newtown Green

A well used and versatile space, lacking benches and opportunities to sit and enjoy the open space. A prime aim of the Happy to Chat bench.

It is at risk of vandalism as happened in 2021 however it is a very open area but it would be well used.

If sited near the SWANCC Noticeboard it could be supervised by the shop and local businesses. It is an ideal location for users of the shops, residents around the green, dog walkers and passers by. There is large number of older and vulnerable residents who are isolated and would benefit from the bench.

Permission is in progress with Ashford Borough Council however it is the understanding of the Clerk that the ABC Ward Cllr has the power to allow a bench to be situated and this is just being confirmed with Anthony Crossley at Ashford Borough Council.

Gas House Fields Allotments

It would add a real benefit to the 73 tenants there and their co-workers there is nothing for all use at present.

It would support the work of the community allotment plot and the living workshop which is open to all residents

It would be more secure than an open area

Cons

It would restrict the use of all residents and be limited to those on the allotment.

This could be funded as a future project to improve the allotments which is already benefiting from a lot of mental health and wellbeing actions

Conclusion

Members should weigh the possible options for the bench subject to the most benefit of residents and the improvement of connection conversation and well being with the security and best protection of the bench.

POLITE NOTICE

This is just a quick note about where your vehicle is parked. It is making it very difficult for other vehicles such as refuse collection lorries and emergency vehicles to get access to the homes in this area.
