Members discussed the distribution for the drone photo via the website and newsletter, the requests from residents to purchase a copy and the request from SWAN centre and Alfred Arms for a Large photo to display for all to review. Also reviewed the drone footage and that further images could be extracted and to ask Jubilee Photographer to investigate this.

Resolved:- To investigate costs and options for 2 large canvas style photos of the SWAN image, to charge for individual copies and aim to make these approximately 8" x 10" and send out by post or hand deliver. To recommend to Council a price is agreed to charge for individual copies of at least £5.00 to cover costs subject to further investigation on costs. Paid advertising allowed for 2633 post engagements compared to the normal number of 233 actual engagements. It was targeted to South Willesborough and Newtown Residents 3 SWAN and Willesborough specific Facebook Groups Anyone who follows the SWANCC page Clicking through to review the Council page received 511 new views, Price per click 8p (See appendix for graphs and totals.) Outcome

The final press release posted at 8pm linked to the website received 1013 views.


